Health Insurance Claim Guide:

For Users of Prosthetic and Orthotic Services



Looking for extra support?

This factsheet is for users of prosthetic or orthotic services looking for extra support **through private health insurance**.

It explains how insurance can help with costs not fully funded under the Standard Package of Care provided by Health NZ. This can include upgraded devices, additional rehabilitation, or advanced technology options.



Understanding what is funded

Health New Zealand funds a Standard Package of Care for prosthetic and orthotic services. This care includes essential assessments, devices and rehabilitation needed for safe mobility and independence.

Some users wish to access features or additional rehabilitation beyond this standard care. This may include:

- Custom or high-tech components e.g. microprocessor knees or high-end carbon fibre feet.
- Cosmetic limb covers.
- Extra rehabilitation support e.g. additional physiotherapy, pain management, or mental health care
- Additional prosthetic limbs for specific activities – e.g. for sports or water use.
- Private consultation services.

Making a health insurance enquiry or claim

Step 1: Contact your health insurer

- Call your insurer's customer service team or log into your member portal.
- Ask what is covered under prosthetic or orthotic services. Also check if these may fall under other categories such as rehabilitation, surgical aids, or assistive technology.
- Request written confirmation of coverage limits, exclusions, and pre-approval requirements.

Step 2: Obtain supporting documentation

You may need:

- A clinical letter or prescription from your prosthetist or orthotist.
- A quote or invoice for the service or device.
- A treatment plan or report outlining why the item or service is needed.

Your clinician and our Funding Application Advisor can help prepare these documents.

Step 3: Submit a pre-approval or claim

- Follow your insurer's process for either a preapproval or retrospective claim.
- Keep copies of all communications and receipts.
- If applicable, note which costs have already been funded by Health NZ.

Tips for success

- Not all health insurance policies automatically cover prosthetic or orthotic services – check your policy wording carefully.
- Ask your provider whether prosthetic devices, or rehab services fall under "medical aids", "major medical", or "specialist consultations".
- If your claim is declined, contact us to review your options.
- Keep all quotes, invoices, and clinical letters for your records.
